

Activating and deactivating shared code

Activating a piece of [shared code](#) deploys the code to the site, where the code is then automatically executed, either on every page load or when the [trigger](#) defined for the code fires. Deactivating a piece of shared code removes the code from the site.

Activating shared code

To activate a piece of shared code:

1. In the Frosmo Control Panel, in the sidebar, select **More > Shared Code**.
2. In the shared code list, find the piece of shared code you want to activate, click the quick menu button for the code, and select **Activate**.



3. To confirm, click **Activate**.

The piece of shared code is now automatically executed on every page load or when the trigger, if defined, fires.

Deactivating shared code

To deactivate a piece of shared code:

1. In the Frosmo Control Panel, in the sidebar, select **More > Shared Code**.
2. In the shared code list, find the piece of shared code you want to deactivate, click the quick menu button for the code, and select **Deactivate**.



3. To confirm, click **Deactivate**.

The piece of shared code is no longer executed on the site (unless a visitor still has the code cached in their browser).

Checking the activation status of shared code

To check the activation status of a piece of shared code:

1. In the Frosmo Control Panel, in the sidebar, select **More > Shared Code**.
2. In the shared code list, find the piece of shared code whose activation status you want to check, and check the status label for the code. The label reads either **Active** or **Inactive**.
